Rules:

1. All entry fees must accompany the official entry form. Entries for light horse classes close on Wednesday 29th July 2026. British Showjumping entries close Monday 10th August 2026. **No late or telephone entries allowed.**
2. There will be **NO ON THE DAY ENTRIES AND NO EXCHANGE OF CLASSES OR WITHDRAWAL REFUNDS ON THE DAY.**
3. We operate a zero tolerance policy with regard to abusive behavior towards all judges, stewards and officials.
4. All entries are subject to the various Rules and Regulations of the Society that are printed in the Official Schedule.
5. **ALL** competitors must wear regulation head protection to current standards/breed society rules at all times when riding.
6. All competitors take part at their own risk. The organisers do not hold themselves responsible for any accident that might occur to horse, rider, property or spectator.
7. All stallions and colts 2 years old or over must be adequately bitted.
8. All stallions/ colts must be shown by someone the age of 16 years or over.
9. All equines attending the show ground must have up to date Equine Influenza vaccinations.
10. Competitors are requested to be in the collecting ring before their class is due to commence, and in the case of jumping classes, to give their name and number to the Collecting Ring Steward.
11. The decision of the judges will be regarded as final.
12. All participants must hold a passport for each horse and carry Third Party Insurance for not less than £2m.
13. Any objections must be made in writing to the General Secretary and be received by her within 30 minutes of the judging. Any person lodging an objection shall deposit the sum of £30, the deposit to be forfeited should the objection not be sustained.
14. All timings are approximate and subject to change; it is the competitor's responsibility to present themselves in the ring for the start of their class.
15. Competitors must exempt themselves from any class where they have a personal or professional relationship with the judge or steward.
16. Rider ages are taken as of 1st January 2026.
17. All equines should present with no evidence of whiskers or sensory hairs having been trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes, in which case you must provide written proof from your vet; this proof must be available at the show if requested by a show official) sensory hairs are the hairs located on the horses muzzle and around the eyes, also known as whiskers that are used for sensation. Any competitor guilty of this will be disqualified.
18. Lead rein competitors; Mare or gelding, 4 yrs. & over, not exceeding 12.2hh (127cm). Rider not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant over 16 years of age on the 1st of January in the current year & shown in snaffle bridles. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.
19. There is to be no mucking out onto the field. All rubbish must be taken with you and not left behind. The field will be checked any lost property will be posted onto the social media page if not collected within a week it will be destroyed.

All equines must be accompanied by a passport

Please make sure you have your passport ready (spot checks will be carried out throughout the day)

EQUINE FLU- all equines attending Ashover Agricultural and horticultural society must have been vaccinated for equine influenza in the past 12 months.

Trophies

All trophies that are won, need collecting from the show secretary's tent, these are signed for with a £10 cash deposit that we hold until the return of your trophies the following year. You are responsible for the engraving of your trophy.

Parking

Horse boxes will be permitted access onto the show ground from 7.00am.

All drivers are obliged to co-operate with the parking stewards. If you are asked to park your vehicle in a space by a parking attendant you must adhere to this. We are a small field for parking. There is plenty of space if parked correctly.

Paper entries please post to light horse secretary, please send your entry with an addressed prepaid/stamped A5 envelope to return your passes/numbers.

Classes 1, 2, 3,4 and 5 are limited to 15 competitors. If sufficient entries classes will be split. Classes 24-27 are limited to 6 competitors.

Entry pass allocation – 1 horse/pony = 2 wristbands

Lead rein competitors will be issued with an extra wristband.

Any other wristbands required please include this into your entry. The total amount of passes paid for will be sent with your competitor passes. You can purchase from www.ashovershow.co.uk On the day passes are available from the show light horse secretary tent or admission kiosk. Failure to do this may result in refusal to the lorry park/show ground.

Each vehicle registration will be issued with 1 vehicle pass. No cars permitted in lorry park.

Spot checks will be made to ensure everyone entering the show has relevant tickets/passes. Exhibitor passes are none transferable and must be worn when on the show ground at all times.

Prize Money

Prize money **WILL NOT BE PAID** directly on the day to any classes other than the gymkhana. Competitors receiving prize money will be given a card with their rosette which is to be presented to the light horse secretary on the day at the conclusion of all that competitors' classes. BACS details will be taken, and prize money will then be paid within the two weeks following the show. Cards must be presented on the day after you finish all your classes. Prize money for any cards not presented on the day will not be payable.

Ashover Show are pleased to be affiliated to the Veteran Horse Society and will be hosting area qualifiers for 2026. Competitors do not have to be members in advance to compete in these classes, but should you qualify then the following information is relevant to you.

Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2026.

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2026

Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which you can exchange for a signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. *This MUST be done within 21 days of qualification.* It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Those wishing to join or renew with the Society will need to apply for this before 1st April each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on 4th – 6th September 2026.No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season 2026.
